# Advance Math Grade Level 6

Although the start of Math 6 may seem "easy" as we will conduct a lot of review, the first chapter on place values, additions and subtractions of whole numbers and decimals will challenge the students at times. We will have two quizzes on Chapter 1 on September 12th and 15th.

Our first test is on Wednesday, September 20th. Please ensure that your student keeps all of their Chapter 1 ST (Student Text) pages in the Return to School section of their Red Subject Folder. We will refer to previous lessons at times. Organization and attention to detail are the kevs to success! We'll end September with the first Chapter 2 quiz on September 27th. We'll finish the month with introduction to Chapter 2 with Multiplication to 2- and 3digit whole numbers and decimals, exponents, and squares/square roots. Everyone in Math 6 is expected to have memorized the multiplication table.

# **Technology**

In the 4th grade Technology Class this month we will be learning:

#### Language

Students will learn that language is:

- Evaluating what they read, hear, and observe

- Seeing patterns and working analytically
- Developing a body of thought in an orderly manner
- Communicating beliefs clearly, forcefully, and persuasively

All classes will continue to develop reading skills, which include:

- Accuracy
- Enunciation
- Alertness to punctuation
- Expression
- Smoothness
- Comprehension
- Volume
- Speed
- Poise

Students will study, review, learn, and be quizzed and tested over vocabulary and definitions from Math, and Science, and their Chapter book, *Alice in Wonderland*.

They will learn to recognize and use verbs, in all their forms and endings.

#### Art

This month the children will review three of the seven elements of art - lines, shape and form.

The 4th graders will draw a honey jar. Using various shapes and lines they create an illusion of form.

#### **Science**

Science 5 for 4th graders will start the Unit 1 with two chapters within the unit: Minerals and Rocks, and Fossils and Dinosaurs. Students will learn the proven method of good content comprehension tools: PQ3R as well as conduct several hands-on activities. There will be a quiz on September 11 and the chapter test on September 21.

#### PE / Spanish

This month in PE, students will participate in games that will work on their ability to:

In Spanish Class, students will:
